Information about us

www.syderfoundation.com is a site operated by The Syder Foundation (“We”). Our registered Charity No. is 1119373. Our address is Po Box 6277, Newbury, Berkshire, RG14 9PN.

Accessing our site

Access to our site is permitted on a temporary basis, and we reserve the right to withdraw or amend the service we provide on our site without notice (see below). We will not be liable if for any reason our site is unavailable at any time or for any period. From time to time, we may restrict access to some parts of our site, or our entire site, to users.

You are responsible for making all arrangements necessary for you to have access to our site. You are also responsible for ensuring that all persons who access our site through your internet connection are aware of these terms, and that they comply with them.

Our site changes regularly

We aim to update our site regularly, and may change the content at any time. Similarly, the terms in this document may vary at any time.

Information about you and your visits to our site

We process information about you in accordance with our Privacy Notice below. By using our site, you consent to such processing and you warrant that all data provided by you is accurate.

Viruses, hacking and other offences

You must not misuse our site by knowingly introducing viruses, trojans, worms, logic bombs or other material which is malicious or technologically harmful. You must not attack our site via a denial-of-service attack or a distributed denial-of service attack.

We will not be liable for any loss or damage caused by a distributed denial-of-service attack, viruses or other technologically harmful material that may infect your computer equipment, computer programs, data or other proprietary material due to your use of our site or to your downloading of any material posted on it, or on any website linked to it.

Website analytics

Our website uses Google Analytics. This provides information about your use of the website and is stored by Google on servers in the United States. Google will use this information for the purpose of evaluating your use of the website, compiling reports on website activity for website operators and providing other services relating to website activity and internet usage.

Google may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on Google's behalf. Google will not associate your IP address with any other data held by Google. 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Privacy Notice

The Syder Foundation is the data controller in respect of all personal data collected on this website. Data controllers are legally responsible for ensuring that personal data they obtain is processed in full compliance with the 2018 General Data Protection Regulations.

By using this website and/or giving personal data to us, you indicate that you consent to us using your personal data in accordance with this Privacy Notice.

What information do we collect

We may obtain personal data from representatives of grantees and potential grantee organisations face-to-face, electronically, on paper (such as any form you complete – including any online form or application) or verbally (such as during any telephone conversations we have with you).

Why we need your information

We need to collect some personal information to allow us to offer our services to you and to comply with our legal and fiduciary duties. We will only collect the minimum amount of information necessary to provide a service to you, or comply with our legal responsibilities. We do not sell personal data. We do not transfer personal data outside of the United Kingdom.

We may occasionally, appoint other organisations to carry out some of the processing activities on our behalf. These may include, for example, technology hosts or printing companies. In these circumstances, we will ensure that your personal data is properly protected and that it is only used in accordance with this Privacy Notice.

Personal information may be collected and processed for the following purposes:-

Grant Applications:

You may have to include personal information within an application submitted to us. If so, you are responsible for confirming you have the written agreement and permissions of any individuals identified in your application, to pass their information to the Syder Foundation. We will only use this information for the purposes of assessing your application, managing or monitoring any grant awarded, related administration or research purposes and for sharing relevant information to other funding organisations to use in their own assessment of applications and managing or monitoring of grants awarded.

We may also contact you in relation to something separate to your application but for a reason we believe to be in the legitimate interest to you and/or your organisation, such as any new or partnership grant schemes that we might develop.

How we process your information

We will only use your personal information for the purpose it was given, we will not keep it for longer than is necessary at which point your information will be destroyed securely. Information provided through a grant application, may be retained for archiving and legal purposes for up to 6 years.

Your personal information will not be shared with a third party unless you have previously been informed and given express consent i.e. on an application form, or it is required by law, such as with the HMRC or with the police for the detection or prevention of crime.

Data Security

Personal data is not stored anywhere other than in our secure email account. Charity and grantee information is stored securely on a separate database only available to trustees and their appointed representatives who need to access data as an essential part of their role. Your name and contact details may be appended to this record if you are the charity's representative.

Your Rights

You have a number of legal rights in respect of your personal data. These include:

The right to receive a copy of the personal data that we hold about you. The same right applies to any other person whose personal data you provide to us. We will require proof of identity and proof of authority if the request comes from someone other than the person whose data we are asked to provide. This will ensure we only provide information to the correct person. We normally expect to respond to requests within 28 days of receiving them. You may request the data in printed or electronic format (Normally csv or pdf) but we will discuss this with you at the time. Requests for Access should be addressed to the DPO.

Withdraw consent to other processing. Where the only legal basis for our processing your personal data is that we have your consent to do so, you may withdraw your consent to that processing at any time and we will have to stop processing your personal data.

If you consider any of your personal data is inaccurate, you can contact us to do it for you.

Changes to this Privacy Notice

Privacy laws and practice are constantly developing and we aim to meet high standards. Our policies and procedures are, therefore, under continual review. We will ensure our website has our most up to date policy and suggest that you check this page periodically to review our latest version.
